

Course: Scaffolding student collaboration for higher order thinking

Length: 3 hours

Summary: Participants will learn how to teach, facilitate and assess student collaboration including how to use the most effective scaffolds.

Sessions:

Session 1: Introduction to student collaboration and higher order thinking

1 hour

In this session, we will briefly look at:

- what we mean by higher order thinking and student collaboration
- the evidence relating to the effectiveness of student collaboration as a teaching strategy
- a review of the options

Session 2: Facilitation strategies and flexible groupings

1 hour

This session will cover:

- strategies for creating effective groups
- scaffolding the work of students in a collaborative setting

Session 3: Monitoring and assessing student collaboration

1 hour

In this session, we examine strategies for:

- monitoring the collaborative work of students
- assessing the collaborative learning process
- assessing the collaborative learning product
